Survey purpose & overview

It also aims to assist in the providing of support to the children of Wakayama Prefecture. Your answers will help in enhancing and improving future support policies, so they are very important. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Data handling

- This questionnaire is anonymous.
- <u>Answers are collated, and that collation will be processed statistically, so individuals and</u> households will remain unidentified.
- The school will not be notified of your answers to the questionnaire or if you took part in the survey or not.
- Also, you will not be contacted regarding your answers from Wakayama Prefecture or any subcontracted companies.

Answering and submitting

- This questionnaire must be answered by the guardian of the child who brought it home.
- The child who brought this survey questionnaire home must, as a general rule, fill out the Elementary Student Survey or Junior High Student Survey on his/her own. However, if your child is unable to write answers on his/her own, the guardian is asked to provide support as needed.

F. Short-period childcare support (short stay)	A system for taking care of children at a child welfare facility when a parent has temporary difficulty caring for their child due to reasons such as being hospitalized, giving birth, caretaking, or job responsibilities.
G. Family Support Center	A service in which people who want help with child raising (User Members) and people who want to help with child raising (Service Members) register. That assistance allows families to maintain jobs while raising children and supports households raising children so that they can live in comfort.
H. Childcare Generation Comprehensive Support Center	Places where parents can talk with people like public health nurses and receive advice and health guidance from pregnancy through the child raising stage.
